Grade 1

• Grade ones have decided on 2 skating sessions. They will be going together, starting this week. The students are looking forward to it

- We have just finished our first writing assignment, applying sight words & invented spelling strategies. Hourra!
- In Math, we are learning about surveys & different charts to display the results
- We will be assessing the students for their reading level. When completed, students will be able to take home books at their best fit
- Students are looking forward to the 100th day which is fast approaching.

- Valentine's Day will also be filled with fun activities

Grade 2

- Grade 2 just finished up our snowman theme from the month of January! Kids finished with a big writing project & made snowmen outside
- We dove right into our theme for February: Hockey!
- We have been reading stories & learning new hockey related vocabulary words
- Grade 2 has also been working on Valentine's Day cards for seniors thanks to Mme Malone & the kangaroos
- We have also been talking & learning about black history month with the help of our spiritual animator Ms Sarah

Phys. Ed.

- Cycle 1 students are being evaluated on manipulation skills that have been covered in class during term 2 (can you move with your object & hit a target?)
- They choose skills & justify their choices. Choices include Hockey stickhandling & wrist shot; Basketball dribble & setshot; Toss & catch as they walk & throw ball against wall. They evaluate their progress by answering questions regarding knowledge of the key parts of the skill performed (check for understanding)
- Cycle 1 Leadership students are assisting the younger kindergarten students with outdoor winter recess games including snowshoeing. They have also been given "Role Playing" tasks to review their understanding of recess game rules & routines. It's amazing how creative they are
- Kindergarten students just love gym activities including freeze dance, listening games & the Champions for Life program. It's a joy to watch them move with such enthusiasm

Music

- K4 Are currently doing music stations where they are using scarves with music & exploring instruments
- K5 Are currently doing music stations. They are creating little rhythms for one another, using puppets & songs & guessing the instrument a classmate plays for them
- Grade 1 Students just finished learning about music from Spain. They learned about Flamenco dancing & made their own castanets. Next we will be learning about music from Italy
- Grade 2 Students started learning about different music genres. Students just finished Country music. Our next genre will be R &B (Rhythm & Blues)
- ELA (Cycle One)
- Students are preparing for the arrival of the artist Jason Sikoak's first visit to SAJ on February 16th.
- As per Jason's request, we are reading & discussing 2 Robert Munsch books he suggested
- One is Give me Back my Dad where the 2 main characters are based on Jason's brother & his niece
- The other book is called A Promise is a Promise which gives a little bit of insight into storytelling in Jason's culture
- We will take this opportunity to discuss a little bit of Jason's background, where he is from & the amazing project that will be taking place throughout the spring involving our school

6.7 Daycare

- Hot lunches continue to be provided twice a week by Merenda
- Merenda no longer sends plastic cutlery due to new government regulations therefore parents are being asked to send in reusable cutlery

- We continue to be outdoors as much as possible if the weather permits

- Our January ped day was a hit! The students enjoyed the glow in the dark mini putt. We had 69 students! The SR school joined us in our building, siblings got to play outside in the morning together
- We had 2 ped days in February. February 3rd was a Winter Wonderland. We ended up staying inside due to weather, but all students got to move in the gym & participate in activities. We had 68 students register
- February 13th was a Valentine's Day theme. They made candles & participated in other activities inside & outside. We had 63 students register
