Kindergarten for 4-year-olds (K4)

The goal of K4 is to promote the global development of the child through a play-based program. A full-time teacher & part-time early childhood educator collaborate to provide a variety of experiences in a rich, engaging environment that is tailored to the needs of preschoolers. K4 is a full year dedicated to a smooth transition to school, where parent participation is valued & encouraged. K4 is taught primarily in English & children may be exposed to, but not instructed in French. The French Immersion as well as theFrançais Plus programs begin in K5

Music

K4 - Students will be introduced to the quarter note (ta) & paired eighth notes (titi). Various activities will focus on the two new notes

K5 - We focused on the quarter note (ta) & paired eighth notes (titi) this last month. Students will continue to focus on those two notes in addition to learning about the quarter rest

Grade 1 - We finished our unit on "Music Around the World." Students will be working on a recycled instrument project

Grade 2 - We have been learning about different composers. Students will be working on a recycled instrument project

ELA

Grade 1 - We are continuing to practice our letter sounds, short vowel sounds & word families. We are focusing on capitalizing the first letter in a sentence & ending the sentence with a period. Students are going to work on writing very simple sentences

Grade 2 - Students will continue to work on word families, as well as short & long vowel sounds. We are learning about the "Magic E." Students are practicing reading simple word family paragraphs with basic sight words. We are practicing writing simple sentences & focusing on basic capitalization & punctuation
